BIOGRAPHIES OF NOMINEES

SUSAN TROXELL has served as Chair since 2021, and has been our Research Librarian since 2015. She has a Juris Doctorate and is retired after practicing law for 20 years. An amateur historical researcher, more than 20 of her articles have appeared in the *Ricardian Bulletin* and *Ricardian Register*, with several being posted in full on the website of the UK's Richard III Society (richardiii.net) as well as having been cited by professional historians. In July 2022, she was invited to speak about Richard III at the Stratford Festival in Ontario, Canada. Her article about the Edward IV Roll project, co-authored with Laura Blanchard, was included in the 2024 Special Centenary issue of *The Ricardian*.

DEBORAH KABACK currently serves as Treasurer of the American Branch. She is a Managing Director of Oppenheimer Asset Management Inc and resides in New Lebanon NY.

WAYNE INGALLS has served as the Membership Chair since 2022. He serves concurrently as the Public Relations Officer.
